- The financial results have been prepared in accordance with Ind AS, notified under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 read with Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015, as amended from time to time, and other accounting principles generally accepted in India and in compliance with Regulation 33 and Regulation 52 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended. Any application guidance / clarifications / directions Issued by the Reserve Bank of India, the NHB or other regulators are implemented as and when they are issued / become applicable.
- The main business of the Company is to provide loans for purchase or constructions of residential houses. All other activities of the Company revolve around the main business and accordingly there are no separate reportable segments, as per the Ind AS 108 "Operating Segments".
- The Covid-19 pandemic has impacted most economics and banking systems globally, including india. The nation-wide lockdown in April-May 2020 substantially impacted economic activity. The easing of lockdown measures subsequently led to gradual improvement in economic activity and progress towards normalcy. These developments resulted in regulatory measures like moratorium on payment of dues and standstill in asset classification to militate the economic consequences on borrow etc. It also resulted in increase in provisioning reflecting higher actual and expected additions to non-performing loans following the cessation of moratorium and asset classification standstill. The second wave of Covid-19 pandemic, where the number of new cases has increased significantly in india, has resulted in re-imposition of localised/regional lockdown measures in various parts of the country. Although, the second wave has started to subside from June 2021 onwards and there has been gradual lifting of lockdown, the impact of the second wave on the Company's results remains uncertain and dependent on future developments, which are often outside of the Company's control and accordingly, actuals may differ from the estimates dependent on future developments, which are often outside of the Company's control and accordingly, actuals may differ from the estimates

The Impact, including credit quality and provision, of the Covid-19 pandemic, on company, is uncertain and will depend on the spread of Covid-19, the effectiveness of current and future steps taken by the governments and central bank to mitigate the economic impact, steps taken by the company and the time it takes for economic activities to return to pre-pandemic levels. - 5 The financial results have been prepared in accordance with Ind AS, notified under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 read with Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015, as amended from time to time, and other accounting principles generally accepted in India and in compliance with Regulation 33 and Regulation 52 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended. Any application guidance /clarifications / directions issued by the Reserve Bank of India, the NHB or other regulators are implemented as and when they are issued / become applicable.
- 6 The main business of the Group is to provide loans for purchase or constructions of residential houses. All other activities of the Group revolve around the main business and accordingly there are no separate reportable segments, as per the Ind AS 108- Operating Segments.
- The Covid-19 pandemic has impacted most economies and banking systems globally, including India. The nation-wide lockdown in April-May 2020 substantially impacted economic activity. The easing of lockdown measures subsequently led to gradual improvement in economic activity and progress towards normalcy. These developments resulted in regulatory measures like moratorium on payment of dues and standstill in asset classification to mitigate the economic consequences on borrow etc. it also resulted in increase in provisioning reflecting higher actual an expected additions to non-performing loans following the cessation of moratorium and asset classification standstill. The second wave of Covid-19 pandemic, where the number of new cases has increased significantly in india, has resulted in re-imposition of localised/regional lockdown measures in various parts of the country. Although, the second wave has started to subside from June 2021 onwards and there has been gradual lifting of lockdown, the impact of the second wave the Group's secults remains uncertain and dependent on future developments, which are often outside of the Group's control and accordingly, actuals may differ from the estimates used in the preparation of the financial statements on the renoring data.

The impact, including credit quality and provision, of the Covid-19 pandemic, on Group, is uncertain and will depend on the spread of Covid-19, the effectiveness of current and future steps taken by the governments and central bank to mitigate the economic impact, steps taken by the Group and the time it takes for economic activities to return to pre-pandemic levels. The Group's capital and liquidity position is strong.
